
Lack of local processors of UFW

Hypotheses to be tested

- Is wood truly under-utilized?
- How much carbon can be offset by wood utilization?
- Is wood utilization better or worse for air quality?
- What is the economic impact of utilization?





Capabilities to be developed

- Mensuration and procurement of urban wood
- Practical ways to transport, stockpile, and sort urban wood
- Technologies to connect urban wood generators and consumers
- Marketing campaigns for urban wood products
- Investment to support start-up companies and innovative solutions to utilization barriers
